




Our focus for recruitment is the **Dahlonega Campus.**



Cybersecurity

- UNG is designated as a National Center for Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense by the Department of Homeland Security and the National Security
- As a state military institution, UNG's Cyber Institute has recruited most faculty from US government NSA. Many domestic students go on to intern or start careers with the FBI/CIA. International students are placed in corporate internships in the Atlanta area. A lot of Fortune 500 companies recruit our students.




- Graduates from Digital Arts concentration have started careers in film special effects for companies like Disney & Marvel
