- This is a traditional style housing option. In each building, there are multiple floors and

halls where you have about 30 students in a hall that shares a community bathroom, and you share a room with one other student. Each level of the buildings are separated by gender. Connecting both Lewis Hall and Lewis Annex is the bridge, which has ping pong, pool, couches, TVs, tables and chairs. This common area can be used by anyone in either one of the buildings and both Hall and Annex also have: mini computer labs with a printer, laundry room with multiple washers and dryers, as well as additional seating and work space to get that homework done.

- I lived in Lewis Annex during my freshman year, Lewis Hall during my sophomore year and shall continue to live in Lewis Hall for my junior year. The reason I chose Lewis is because of the close community, cheap on campus housing and the location.
