Background: The John Harrison Hosch Library is the fifth stop on our tour. It is beside Mathis Drive and diagonal to the Rec. Center. This building is two stories tall.

Michelle: We are allowed to check out 100 books at one time because we have students in the graduate programs here at UNG who need to do intensive research. Therefore, they need to check out multiple sources at one time.

Michelle: However, it does not stop there the library has study rooms that can cater to your needs. For example, there are small study rooms for groups of two to three people and rooms for groups of six to eight students.

Michelle: The UNG librarians are always happy to help, and you can sign up for a one-on-one research consultation to help navigating in-dept research for a paper, project, or class assignment.

Michelle: Definitely take advantage of this resource! I know that I am always coming into the library to work on assignments and the librarians are always of a great help with finding the specific books I need.
