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# **Employer Spotlight: Syfan Logistics**



**Syfan Logistics**, a transportation logistics company in Gainesville, GA, is a steadfast supporter of UNG students. Syfan's ongoing commitment to excellence, integrity, people, and service has played a pivotal role in the professional development of many students at UNG.

We recently talked with Dan Bacus, Director of Community & Academic Relations, about Syfan's successful internship program and the value of workplace learning and mentorship.

### Q: Tell us about the Syfan Logistics Internship Program.

A: Syfan's Academic Relations program facilitates Fall and Spring individual internships, a teambased summer internship experience, and a Spring virtual mentorship. These opportunities serve as an introduction to the transportation logistics industry and the functions required to support our core business operations. We focus on providing students real-world learning and work experiences across all areas of Syfan. We have learning pathways in Logistics Operations, Accounting and Finance, Information Technology (Data Analytics and IT operations), Human Resources, Sales, and Marketing & Media Communications. Our summer internship also provides opportunities with Turbo Terminal Tractors at our Savannah, GA office and with our freight factoring company, Trilogy. As part of our internship team's training, we provide Lean Six Sigma workshops for students to become familiar with the methods and tools they will need to successfully complete quality improvement projects within our operations.

## Q: Can you share a Syfan-UNG success story?

A: David joined the 2023 summer internship team to have third-party logistics operations experience. David did a great job in his logistics operations role and successfully led our first internship operations quality improvement team in completing process mapping with one of our expedited automotive freight divisions. Approximately halfway through the internship, David expressed having an interest in organizational development as part of the Human Resources team. We provided David a micro-internship rotation in organizational development that validated his curiosity and interest in that career direction. As a result, David was offered a Spring 2024 internship with our Learning and Development team and his performance as a classroom facilitator and course content developer was outstanding. David completed the 2024 summer internship as a learning and development post-graduate intern team member and joined Syfan in his first-career opportunity as a learning and development specialist. It is extremely gratifying to know that David's first-career destination is the result of his initial interest in logistics as a UNG logistics student. David's story is a testimony to the different pathways, possibilities, and opportunities that an internship can provide UNG students.

#### How did you hear about your internship?

#### What has been the most valuable (or favorite) part of the experience?

Within the internship program, I will have completed levels 1 and 2 of the certification, played over 40 hours within the hospital, and trained in the hospital's 'Work Day' program.
