 - Responsible for supervising approximately 200 low-risk felony probationers through regular office appointments, random drug and alcohol screening, and court sentence compliance.

- **High Risk & Drug Court Offenders: Probation Officer I.**
 - Responsible for supervising approximately 50 high risk felony probationers through weekly random home visits, random drug and alcohol screening, random vehicle and home searches, and court sentence compliance.
 - Responsible for acting as the liaison between the North Enotah Drug Court and the probation office.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY SUPERVISION

(2015-2017)

Community Supervision Officer (CSO) II & III, Dahlonega, Georgia

- **CSO II of the Dahlonega Day Reporting Center Lite (DRC-Lite).** The DRC Lite is an alternative to incarceration that provide substance abuse treatment.
 - Supervised approximately 50 felony probationers and parolees through weekly random home visits, weekly drug and alcohol screening, random home and vehicle searches, making arrests for violations, offender and family communication, and court sentence compliance.
 - Responsible for operating and maintaining the lab for testing urine samples submitted by the offenders.

- **Sentencing Specialist/Community Supervision Officer II.**
 - Responsible for court dates pertaining to new felony sentences and Pre-Sentence Investigations in their circuit.
 - Responsible for scheduling other officers to be present for court on days where there are multiple judges in one courthouse or multiple courthouses.
 - Responsible for any communication between the courts and the Community Supervision Office.

- **CSO III for Sex Offenders.**
 - Supervised approximately 50 registered sex offenders who were under parole and/or probation supervision.
 - Supervised each offender through weekly random home visits, random vehicle and home searches, random drug and alcohol screening, offender and family communication, communication with treatment provider, electronic monitoring (for those required to have monitoring),

court sentence compliance, and communication with local law enforcement regarding registration requirements.
