#### **COST COMPARISON\***

Cost of a summer at UNG: \$6,000-10,000 vs Cost of a summer abroad: \$6,000-\$12,000

Cost of a semester at UNG: \$14,000-20,000 vs Cost of a semester abroad: \$11,000-\$30,000
