#### The Year in Review

This year UNG celebrated its sesquicentennial, and it has been a great opportunity to reflect on 150 years of our university's history as well as our future. In commemoration of reaching this milestone, UNG published "The University of North Georgia, 150 Years of Leadership and Vision" and I was honored to co-write a chapter for the book that focuses on the future of international education and our efforts to create a global learning environment for all learners at UNG.

One important foundational element for the global learning environment is creating a set of learning outcomes. CGE brought together a working group consisting of staff from Academic Affairs, Student Affairs, Military Programs and a faculty from each College to create a set of Global Learning Outcomes. They did great work and I am grateful for their support. The rubric {https://ung.edu/global-engagement/global-learning-outcomes.php} will be used for programs, both curricular and co-curricular, that are facilitated by CGE. The group leaned heavily on the American Association of Colleges & Universities' well vetted set of rubrics as a starting point. CGE looks forward to implementing the outcomes starting with our faculty-led study abroad programs in the coming year. This will be an excellent way for CGE to build better assessment of faculty's important work in global learning.

In other news, I am very encouraged by the number of students who are interested in education abroad and study away programs, who are meeting CGE advisors to learn more about how these opportunities fit into their plan of study, and who are making plans for future travel. We are well on our way to recovering our enrollments to pre-pandemic numbers and I am grateful to the students, faculty and CGE staff for their dedication and resilience.

#### Looking ahead: 2023 goals

#### Major themes from the ACE Internationalization Lab Report

- UNG should assess the current global learning opportunities and build intentional curricular and co-curricular pathways to global learning for all its students. The upcoming revision of the general education requirements can be used as a starting place for building new opportunities.
- UNG should tell its story of internationalization by communicating current international opportunities for field work, research, and study, highlighting international students, scholars, and faculty, and promoting our current partnerships. Improved communications will assist the university with its fundraising efforts related to internationalization.
- Create and implement professional development for faculty and staff in the following areas:
  - Mglobal learning and curricular design
  - Mintercultural communication
  - ☐ Ifaculty support to lead support study abroad programs ☐ Ifaculty support for international research collaboration
- Create appropriate structures (faculty mentoring, college liaisons, advisory councils, etc.) for faculty engagement related to internationalization. These could be for international student integration into UNG classrooms, creating new education abroad opportunities, partnership development, Ung policy review, and a host of other related efforts.
- Promote the values of diversity, inclusion, and equity throughout CGE programming and especially in student, scholar, and faculty recruitment efforts. Increasing the number of international students and scholars on our campuses as well as being intentional in our recruitment of diverse populations into our education abroad opportunities will further UNG's goals in this area.
- Closely examine assessment methods of CGE programs and services to ensure appropriate design, outcomes, and continuous improvement.

CGE has leveraged these themes since the completion of the ACE Internationalization Lab in January 2021 to create a set of annual planning goals for implementation.



Short-term development to reach long-term goals

- Creation of UNG Global Learning
  Outcomes rubric for use with CGE
  facilitated programming including
  faculty-led study abroad and co-curricular
  activities.
- Implementation of faculty development workshops for COIL activities starting in fall, 2023.
- Organize university-wide activities that focus on strategic global partnerships.

  Japan Expo in April 2023, was an example of this type of programming.
- Execute international enrollment management plan to increase UNG brand awareness, lead generation and undergraduate F-1 applications.
- Examination of education abroad portfolio and its academic integration so that education abroad can be a seamless part of a student's study plan.
