If the student will continue working after Work Study funds are exhausted, departmental funds will be needed to cover the additional salary paid as an Institutional Student Assistant.

This section is used to determine minimum and maximum salaries for specialized student assistants such as students required to have certification in CPR, group exercise Instruction and personal training, student tutor, teaching assistant, learning assistant, lab assistant. See additional information below.

Learning Assistants largely assist with facilitating small group interaction (in group activities, tutorials, and clicker questions, for example), and other activities that capitalize on their skills in identifying and addressing student difficulties with conceptual content.

**Student Tutor** - Reviews classroom topics and assignments. Assists students with homework, projects, test preparation, papers, research and other academic tasks. Works with students to help them understand key concepts

Student Lab Assistant - Typical duties include setting up labs, preparing simple chemical solutions, cleaning equipment and answering student's questions during a lab experiment.

**Teaching Assistant** - help teachers prepare for lessons by getting materials ready, setting up equipment and arranging the classroom environment. May assist the classroom teacher with grading tests.

Certified Student Assistant - Group Exercises Instructors create and deliver fitness classes; ensures safety of participants.

Institutional and Work Study Student Assistants - operate standard office equipment. Filing; sorting and/or alphabetizing documents; copying; answering telephones; greeting visitors; assists with bulk mailing projects; pickups and deliveries.
