

B.Mus. in Instrumental Music Education w/Recording & Production Cert. Course Planning Guide ~ Four-year Plan (w/Summers)

1. Area A courses must be completed within the first 30 hours.
2. Piano proficiency should be completed by the end of semester four.
3. Guitar proficiency should be completed by the end of semester six.
4. Students must successfully pass a barrier jury prior to moving into upper division applied study.
5. Student should apply to the College of Education in semester six ahead of part-time student teaching (MUED 4280 & 4290). EDUC 2110, 2120, and 2130 must be completed (or in the semester of completion) to apply for admittance into the COE.
6. It is recommended that EDUC 2120 be taken in the same semester as Intro to Sociology and EDUC 2130 in the same semester as Intro to Psychology and General Methods and Curriculum.
7. Placement in the plan does not guarantee course availability. Please consult with your Academic Advisor.
8. A grade of "C" or higher is required in all MUSC, MUAP, and MUED courses unless otherwise specified
