Professional Licensure or Certification Disclosure

Post-Professional Doctor of Physical Therapy (PPDPT)

The Post-Professional Doctor of Physical Therapy degree is designed for:

- 1. **U.S. licensed physical therapists** who wish to attain a transitional Doctor of Physical Therapy degree as their initial graduation was not at the doctoral level.
- 2. **Foreign-educated physical therapists** who do not meet U.S. requirements to be licensed in any state as they have not graduated from a CAPTE accredited physical therapy program. Participants will have the chance to remediate some of the deficiencies seen during educational credential evaluations.

UNG will not guarantee that a Foreign-Educated Physical Therapist (FEPT) will be able to meet all requirements for licensure in the United States.

The Post-Professional Doctor of Physical Therapy (PPDPT) degree is not designed to qualify individuals to secure licensure in the United States.
