Master of Accountancy (M.Acc.)

Educational Requirements are Met for CPA Exam

Upon successful completion of the Master of Accountancy (M.Acc.) curriculum, University of North Georgia graduates will have **met all educational requirements** to sit for the national CPA Exam.

Since the CPA Exam is a national exam, students from any state can qualify to take the exam by graduating from the UNG Master of Accountancy program.

An individual can be employed as an accountant by passing the CPA Exam. However, there are specialized accounting services that require a Georgia CPA license.
