Family Nurse Practitioner (MSN)

Upon successful completion of the Master of Science in Nursing with a concentration in Family Nurse Practitioner program, University of North Georgia graduates will have **satisfied all educational** requirements to be eligible to sit for the **Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP)** certification exam required for practice as an FNP.

Family Nurse Practitioner Certification

The <u>American Nurses Credentials Center</u> (ANCC) and <u>American Academy of Nurse</u> <u>Practitioners (AANP)</u> provide nurse practitioner board certification examinations. Upon successful national certification, the student (who already holds a registered nurse license in their state or a compact license) can apply for state certification as an FNP.
