Students who plan to pursue professional licensure or certification in a state other than Georgia should contact the program coordinator and the appropriate licensing entity for additional information and guidance.

Professional Licensure or Certification Disclosure

Upon completion of the program, University of North Georgia (UNG) graduates will have **satisfied all educational** requirements, be eligible to sit for the national exam, and submit their credentials to a state board for licensure **in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and U.S. territories.**
