Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT)

Upon completion of the program, University of North Georgia graduates will have **satisfied all educational** requirements to sit for the [National Physical Therapy Exam](#) (NPTE).

Graduates that pass the NPTE can submit their credentials to a state board and apply for physical therapy licensure.
