Chemistry

Principles of Chemistry I with lab (Equivalent to UNG - CHEM 1211/K)

Principles of Chemistry II with Lab (Equivalent to UNG - CHEM 1212/K)

Physics

Introduction of Physics I with lab (Equivalent to UNG - PHYS 1111/L or PHYS 2211/L)

Introduction of Physics II with lab (Equivalent to UNG - PHYS 1112/L or PHYS 2212/L)

Two Social/Behavioral Science Courses

Psychology is highly preferred; however, most psychology or sociology courses will fulfill this requirement.

Statistics

Introduction to Statistics (Equivalent to UNG - Math 1401)

The statistics course should cover descriptive statistics, probability theory & distributions, hypothesis testing, linear regression, and correlation. We also highly suggest a statistics course with ANOVA.

There are no course substitutions for the required prerequisite courses above. Applicants should complete a minimum of eight prerequisite courses prior to applying to the program. Any repeated courses will be averaged.

Credit will be given for Advanced Placement (AP) courses, but it is advised that no more than one major course of the ten prerequisite courses be completed via AP credit.

Currently, there is no limit to the age of the coursework you have completed. We accept coursework from all years.
