Program Overview

- The Georgia Legislative Intern Program was started in the 1970's by then Lt. Governor Zell Miller.
- Over 50 students from Georgia colleges and universities participate in the program each year and receive first-hand legislative experience.
- The legislative session starts on the 2nd Monday in January and typically runs through the end of March (sessions are 40 calendar days).

Tasks and Duties

- Once students are selected for the internship, they are assigned to offices in the Georgia House of Representatives or the Georgia Senate.
- Each intern will serve a unique purpose in the process and have a multitude of different tasks to perform each day that may include;
 - □ legislative tracking
 - □ constituent services
 - ☐ media assistance
 - □ attendance at committee meetings
 - □ writing bill summaries and so much more

Qualifications

- Applicants must be a junior or senior in a college or university in the State of Georgia as of January 2025
 - Applicants must NOT have graduated prior to the beginning of the legislative session
- Program is open to ALL majors
- Student must receive school credit from your college or university
 - Students are advised NOT to take any additional classes while serving as an intern
- This is a **FULL TIME** internship
 - Work hours are generally 8:00am 5:00pm; however, office hours can fluctuate on a daily basis

Application Process

- With the help of Georgia State University, interested applicants will submit their completed applications for consideration
- All applicants will interview with House and Senate staff to determine if the applicant will be considered for the program
- If selected, applicants will be interviewed again to determine placement

Application Process Continued

- Application and reference forms can be found at the website for the Georgia Legislative Internship Program (https://www.legis.ga.gov/intern-program)
 - Unofficial, electronic transcripts are allowed
- Each applicant will submit the completed application form, a resume, a 2-5 page personal essay, a transcript, and references (at least two from professors)

Application Process Continued

- Applications are to be turned in as a *single PDF document*
- Applicants should submit their completed applications to their Campus Coordinator
 * Contact your school's campus coordinator for your school's specific application deadline
- College Coordinators must submit all completed applications to the GLIP Director at glip@gsu.edu by October 15, 2025



Important Dates

- October 15, 2025: Application deadline for College Coordinators submission to Georgia State
 - Intern applicants submit their applications to their College Coordinators, not the General Assembly
 - Contact your College Coordinator to find out your school's application deadline, as it will likely be well before October 15.
- Week of October 20, 2025: Candidate Interviews
- Mid-December 2025: Intern Placement Interviews
- Orientation January 7-19, 2026
- Monday, January 12, 2026: First Day of Legislative Session
