His previous assignments as a general officer included Commander,
Combined Joint Task Force-Operation Inherent Resolve,
Operation INHERENT RESOLVE, Iraq; U.S. Army Deputy Chief of Staff,
G-3/5/7; Commanding General, 1st Cavalry Division; and Deputy
Commanding General (Maneuver), 1st Cavalry Division. Prior to
becoming a general, he served in three different Armored Cavalry
Regiments and in several significant staff positions.
