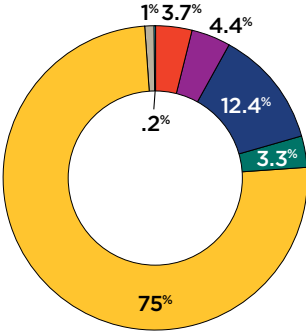

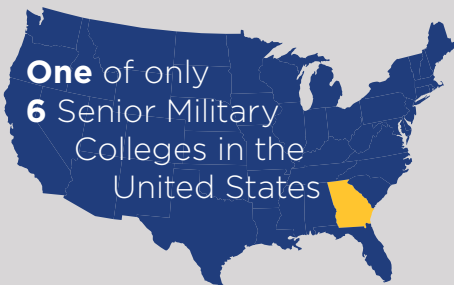


Average SAT of First-Time Freshmen: **1108**

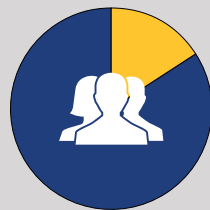
