UNG's 2nd Annual 9/11 National Day of Service Meal Packing Event aims to draw attention to this issue and catalyze support for ongoing efforts to combat food insecurity.

The meals donated through this event has allowed UNG to establish a robust partnership with the Georgia Mountain Food Bank, who works collaboratively with over 60 agencies that combat food insecurity in 5 Georgia counties of Lumpkin, Dawson, Forsyth, Hall and Union.
