

No Contact Order Expectations

A No Contact Order provides supportive measures and minimizes any future negative impact on the parties in the case. A No Contact Order has been issued in this case by the University of North Georgia.

This means that neither party involved in this case may have any contact with the other, directly, or indirectly, in person or through another party, by telephone, written communication, e-mail, social media, direct messaging, websites, or by any other means. This applies on campus, in the local vicinity (i.e., areas adjacent to campus), and University sponsored events. If you need to communicate with the other party at any time, you may do so only through the Title IX Office or an authorized third party.

Furthermore, you must make a concerted effort to avoid any close proximity to the other party, as follows:

- In areas where you are not required to be present, the one who arrives first can stay in the location, and the other party must leave.
- In areas where you are both required to be present, you must avoid being near one another to the greatest, reasonable extent possible. This situation includes on-campus spaces such as the library, dining facilities, recreational areas, etc.
- You may not be present in areas where their presence is required, and yours is not.
- They may not be present in areas where your presence is required, and theirs is not.

In the case of certain community events held in large venues (e.g., sporting events) where significant distance can be maintained, you may both attend, provided that you avoid close proximity.

You must choose an alternate route to avoid intentionally making contact if you happen upon the other party accidentally or see them from a distance on or off campus. In addition, you should not focus on the other party by staring, gesturing, or other similar actions.

The other party has received these exact instructions. This Order will remain in effect until you are informed it has been modified or revoked. Should your circumstances change in a way that you believe impacts this Order, reach out to the Title IX Office so consideration can be given to adjusting the terms of this Order.

This Order does not indicate responsibility for violating University policy; instead, it is a supportive measure intended to promote safety and well-being for both parties. No Contact Orders do not, in and of themselves, become part of the recipient's permanent University record. However, failure to comply with this directive may result in disciplinary action and potential sanctions, including possible suspension or expulsion from the University of North Georgia.

The expectation is that you understand the seriousness with which the University must uphold its standards and protect the rights and responsibilities of our community.
