

As you are aware, a review is underway to identify the other U.S. states from which driver’s licenses and state-issued ID cards may be accepted as evidence of U.S. lawful presence for the purpose of applying BOR Policies 4.1.6, 4.3.4, and 7.3.4.1. While the review is ongoing, we want to provide an initial list of the states from which licenses and ID cards may now be accepted as evidence of U.S. lawful presence. Since states may issue REAL ID compliant licenses and IDs to non-citizens who do not have U.S. lawful presence under the BOR policies, the requirements for acceptance are provided for each state below.

Only unexpired licenses and state-issued IDs with the REAL ID symbol may be accepted. Information on the REAL ID symbol and examples are provided on the attached TSA REAL ID Factsheet (also available online at [www.tsa.gov/sites/default/files/resources/realid\\_factsheet.pdf](http://www.tsa.gov/sites/default/files/resources/realid_factsheet.pdf)). Licenses and IDs marked “Not for REAL ID Purposes”, “Federal Limits Apply”, or similar may not be accepted.

Temporary/interim driver’s licenses and IDs (paper copy provided until the official DL/ID card is generated) cannot be accepted.

State	DL/ID Requirements for Acceptance
Alabama	Must NOT be marked “FN”
Alaska	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”
California	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”. Instruction Permits, Commercial Learner’s Permits, and temporary licenses cannot be accepted.
Delaware	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term” or “Temporary”
Florida	Must NOT be marked “Temporary”
Georgia	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”
Idaho	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”
Iowa	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”
Kentucky	Must NOT be marked “Not for REAL ID purposes”
Louisiana	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”
Maryland	Must NOT indicate “T” restriction
Missouri	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”
Montana	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term” or “Temporary”
Nevada	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”
North Carolina	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”
Ohio	Must NOT indicate that it is “nonrenewable and nontransferable”
Oklahoma	Must NOT be marked “Temporary”
South Carolina	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”
Tennessee	Must NOT be marked “Temporary”
Texas	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term” or “Temporary”
Vermont	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”
Wisconsin	Must NOT be marked “Limited Term”

If you supervise staff who are responsible for reviewing lawful presence documents, please ensure they are aware that driver’s licenses and ID cards from the above states may now be accepted provided the document meets the parameters specified for the state.
