### *Requirements for Each Foundations Course*

Students will pass Foundations Portfolio Review when earning an average score of 2 or higher.

Students who fail portfolio review will be directed to:

Retake the courses with low scores and redo the review the following semester, or

Pursue a minor in art and change major to a degree program outside of the Visual Arts.
